## **Confirmation Parent Guide**

### What is Confirmation?

In the Lutheran Church, confirmation is a public rite that reaffirms a person's baptism and commitment to living out their faith in Jesus Christ. At King of Kings, this is an opportunity for Middle School students to reignite the faith they received through baptism and fan the flame so that they may live as called, unashamed, and purposeful followers of Jesus Christ every day.

Confirmation is structured as a two-year program for middle school students that includes 40 lessons split into four semesters (fall and winter each year). Lessons take place on Sundays and include games and snacks, worship, large group teaching and activities, and small group discussion. It culminates in a Confirmation Ceremony where students will confirm their faith in front of family and friends.

### What is the role of parents in Confirmation?

Parents are the most important role models and primary teachers for faith formation in their children. Parents should be active and involved in the church, attending worship regularly and volunteering when able. Discussions about faith, prayer, and Bible reading should be happening regularly throughout the week at home. This sets an example for students in Christian living.

Confirmation is not a graduation. It is one step that students take in their faith journey to learn how to own their faith and confirm that this is what they believe. The church's job is to come alongside you as a resource for helping your children grow in their faith.

### **Student Notes**

Confirmation students will be given a three-ring binder and each week they will receive a handout for taking notes during the large group teaching. By the end of the two-year program, they will have all 40 lesson notes to look back on in their binder.

## **Faith Talks**

Before confirming their faith publicly, students will have a conversation with a staff member. They will discuss how their faith has grown over the last two years and where they see themselves in the future. Faith Talks will be low pressure and conversational – not a quiz of everything they have learned. It will help inform staff members about where each student is in their faith journey and if they are individually ready to confirm their faith.

# **Confirmation Ceremony**

The Confirmation Ceremony will take place each spring. Students who have completed both years of the program will have the opportunity to Confirm their faith in front of friends and family. This Ceremony will include worship, a brief message, a blessing time with families and staff members, and a celebration together afterward.
