CHURCH DEFINING MOMENTS

1962

King of Kings's first worship services were held at the Western Electric Auditorium with seventy-five people in attendance.



1963

We broke ground on our first building, located at 124th and Center. With a bold and unique design, worship was conducted in the round. The building would be expanded in 1975 and again in 1983.



1993

Following decades of growth, space was getting tight at our 124th and Center location. The congregation passed a resolution to sell the building and purchase the Seagate property at 120th and I Street. With approval from the city council, construction began, converting the former factory into the home of our I Street Campus. This year also marks the arrival of Pastor Mark Zehnder, who served at King of Kings for twenty-nine years.

1991

King of Kings is listed as the fifty-seventh fastest-growing church in the nation.

1994

The congregation officially left the 124th and Center location as 2,200 members gathered to walk to our new home. Omaha Police closed Center and 120th Street to allow safe passage for participants who carried flags, balloons, and boomboxes tuned to Christian radio.



2004

In a leap of faith, courage, and trust, the congregation purchased 132 acres of farmland in Sarpy County as a potential new home for King of Kings.

2019

Our congregation voted to sell our land in Sarpy County as the surroundings developed into an industrial area. Pastor Greg Griffith accepted a call to King of Kings and later became lead pastor in 2020.



2023

King of Kings Northwest Omaha launches as we become a multi-site church. Utilizing video streaming, we began broadcasting sermons to the congregation gathering at Concordia Omaha, located at 156th and Fort.

2015

All of King of Kings's debt was paid off, and the church has been debt-free ever since.

2020

The majority of our land in Sarpy County—ninety-four acres—sold for \$11.7 million, with the principal of the sale being invested and using the accrued interest to support new campuses and new ministry at King of Kings.

OUR VISION

As a Bible-believing church with a call to grow our influence in Omaha, we trust God has an exciting future ahead for our church. The city we live in and the world we engage with have changed dramatically over the past decade. While our mission remains the same, our reach needs to expand. Welcome to the **Let's Go** initiative.

Since its inception, King of Kings has embodied a people who will do whatever it takes, both locally and globally, to be modern-day witnesses of God. We are proud to be part of a church that boasts an incredible sixty-plus-year history of people who have been fully reliant on God, authentic in sharing our lives, courageous in taking new ground, and generous in showing the love of God to our city and world.

From locating a church site in a warehouse and launching a kids curriculum to be shared with churches around the world, to planting a new campus in the fall of 2023 in Northwest Omaha, one could say we've done a lot. Why not just sit back and rest? But that isn't the spirit that the Lord has given to us.

At the forefront of our mission is being faithful to God's command and doing whatever it takes, even if it requires sacrifice, to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth. Others in our church history have gone before us, and now it's our turn to do this for the sake of the church of the future.

Let's Go is a two-year faith and giving initiative to reach our God-sized vision to sustain, strengthen, and expand our ministry for generations to come.





OUR PLANS

+ SUSTAINING OUR MINISTRY

\$7.5 MILLION

This represents our current operating budget for the next two years as we invest in the ongoing ministries at King of Kings. Through your faith and generosity, we will continue to see lives transformed through what God is already doing in kids, students, and adults.

+ STRENGTHENING OUR MINISTRY

\$1.15 MILLION

We will invest in the next generation by putting \$250,000 toward Student and Kids Ministry at our I Street Campus and \$100,000 toward Student and Kids Ministry at our Northwest Campus. This will enable us to provide more engaging and relevant ministry to the next generation. Additionally, \$800,000 will go toward facility maintenance and improvements at our I Street Campus.

+ EXPANDING OUR MINISTRY

\$4 MILLION

The best way to reach new people for Jesus and activate faith in current believers is by planting new churches and opening new campuses. We have worked diligently over the past several years to build healthy ministries at King of Kings and are ready to expand what God is doing here with two new campuses.

+ ALL IN

\$600,000

For the past three years, we've set apart three weeks of the year to love others generously by giving above and beyond our tithe to organizations in our community and around the world. Whether it's buying drones for the Omaha Police and Fire Departments, providing housing for refugees, or supporting global missions in India, Cambodia, and Guatemala, the impact is long-lasting and far-reaching. This \$600,000 budget enables us to continue the impact of All In without an additional financial request from families during the **Let's Go** initiative.

+ INITIATIVE COSTS

\$250,000

This covers the cost of all aspects of the capital initiative, including design, print, video, and events.





WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

Strengthening our Student and Kids Ministries is about more than just expanding programs—it's about creating a nurturing environment where young people encounter the love of Jesus in transformative ways.

As the world around us continues to present new challenges, our response is to equip our youngest members with a faith that is strong, resilient, and ready to shine in every circumstance. By enhancing our facilities, developing more engaging programs, and providing the resources needed to connect with the next generation, we are ensuring that the legacy of faith at King of Kings will not only endure but thrive. At our I Street Campus, some facility upgrades, such as a new chiller, will be needed in the coming years. These upgrades aren't exciting, but they're important so that we can continue our ministry and be good stewards of the building God has provided for us.

Inspired by the vision to open ten new campuses in twenty years, we believe that planting new churches is the most effective way to reach new people for Jesus Christ. This initiative is not just about maintaining our current ministries, but also about boldly taking new ground for the Kingdom. By leveraging the successful multi-site model, which has a 90 percent success rate, we aim to increase both the quantity and quality of disciples, fulfilling Jesus's command to "go and make disciples of all nations."

***Let's Go* builds on our sixty-two-year legacy of relentless dedication to spreading the Gospel. It is now our turn to dream, give generously, and ensure that future generations can experience the transformative love of Jesus.**

GOALS

PRIMARY GOAL

Our primary goal is 100 percent engagement. We want every person to take his or her next step in discipleship and grow in generosity through this initiative. 
GROW PURPOSEFULLY

WEEK ONE

THE BIRTH OF THE CHURCH

It's vitally important that we wait on God's plan and trust His timing. King of Kings has a history of patiently waiting upon the Lord and acting when He calls us to move, and that obedience and faith have always served us well. During this initiative, we must maintain mission clarity, engage with passion, and trust in God's work through the Holy Spirit, all while serving others and growing in our faith. All in all, we entrust this mission and this initiative to God, and we're confident He has nothing but good plans for it and our church's future.

Icebreaker

If you could only eat at one fast food restaurant for the rest of your life, which would you choose?

Discussion Questions

1. Why is waiting upon the Lord important, and how is patience connected to obedience and faith?

Application: In what ways have you experienced waiting on God's timing in your personal life, and how has it helped you grow in obedience and faith?

2. Read Acts 1:7-8. How is the mission of the church that Jesus sets forth in that passage relevant in our lives today?

Application: What are some practical ways you can contribute to fulfilling this mission in your daily life and interactions with others?

3. Pastor Greg listed six distinct actions that will fuel the success of this initiative: leading with purpose, engaging with passion, trusting in God, serving others, growing in faith, and overcoming obstacles. How can we effectively participate in the six key actions laid out in the sermon for a purpose-driven congregation?

Application: Which of these actions do you believe you excel at, and which ones could you improve in your personal life and involvement within your church community?

4. What does it mean to engage with passion as demonstrated by the disciples in Acts 2?

Application: Can you recall a moment when you witnessed the work of God, and how did that experience cultivate passion for your faith?

5. Read Acts 2:5-11. How does serving others play a role in spreading the message of God?

Application: What kind of acts of service have you partaken in or witnessed that effectively communicate the love and message of God to those in need?

Close in prayer.

WEEK TWO

BOLD FAITH IN ACTION

As displayed by the early church in Acts, faith in Jesus can lead to transformation and sharing His love. When we prioritize relationships and acting for others, we can truly transform lives. We must have a unified mission and boldness in living out our faith, trusting in the power of Jesus's name to bring about change and impact others.

Icebreaker

Which app do you use the most on your phone? Why do you use it often?

Discussion Questions

1. Why do you think relationships are so significant in our faith journey?

Application: In your own life, how have relationships impacted your faith, and what steps can you take to strengthen relationships with others?

2. Read Acts 3:1-3. How does Peter and John's encounter with the lame man demonstrate the importance of taking action for others?

Application: What actions can you take in your own life to demonstrate your faith in a tangible way, providing something greater than temporary relief for those in need?

3. How does the story of Peter and John in Acts 4:1-5 show the cost of sharing Jesus, and what modern-day lessons can we draw from it?

Application: Have you ever faced opposition or challenges due to your faith? How did you respond, and what can you learn from Peter and John's example?

4. Why is unity important in fulfilling our mission as believers?

Application: How can you contribute to unity within your own faith community and foster a sense of togetherness in serving others and sharing Jesus?

5. Read Acts 4:13-14. What does the boldness of Peter and John teach us about the power of Jesus's name and the potential impact of our own faith?

Application: What steps can you take to deepen your relationship with Jesus and develop a bold faith that can make a difference in the lives of others?

Close in prayer.

WEEK THREE

GROWING THE CHURCH INSIDE AND OUTSIDE

There's a pivotal meeting in Acts 6:1-7 that plays a critical role in the history of the church. Here was established the essential dual mission of the church: preaching the Gospel and caring for the poor. We still face this balance today: the timeless command to evangelize and attend to those in need. To do so may require the church to adapt its methods while upholding its core values. At King of Kings, we aim to embrace generosity and continue growing, serving, and proclaiming the Gospel in new ways for the benefit of all.

Icebreaker

What's the most important meeting you've been a part of and why?

Discussion Questions

1. Read Acts 6:1-7. Why did the early church leaders in Acts 6 feel the need to hold a pivotal meeting?

Application: Have you ever faced a situation in your life where you needed to make decisions or changes in response to growth or changing circumstances?

2. How do you think the church and its people can best balance their dual call of preaching the Gospel and ministering the Word, as well as taking care of the poor and needy?

Application: Which of these two aspects do you personally prioritize more and why?

3. How can the church balance the need to reach new people while also building up current members and serving those in need?

Application: What are some practical ways you can contribute to this balance in your personal life and your local church community?

4. Read Mark 16:15. How does Jesus's commandment to "go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation" apply to our daily lives?

Application: What are some opportunities or situations in your daily life where you can share the Gospel with others?

5. In what ways can the church modernize methods to better serve its mission in a changing world?

Application: What are some new methods or approaches you believe your local church can adopt to effectively reach and serve people today?

Close in prayer.

WEEK FOUR

HOW THE CHURCH GOES BEYOND BORDERS

Acts 10 is an absolute game-changer for us as Christians. This is when God tells Peter that He wants His message of hope to be shared not just with the Jews but with all people. God's desire is still for all to be saved, and it's our job as Christians and members of King of Kings to ask God, "How can we do our best to accomplish Your vision and bring others to Christ?" and then act accordingly.

Icebreaker

What's the best off-menu item you've ever ordered and why?

Discussion Questions

1. Read Acts 10:9-22. What parallels can you draw between the clean and unclean animals in Peter's vision and how God views Jews and gentiles?

Application: Have you ever faced discrimination from others in the church because of your church background? Have you judged others because of their church background?

2. Read Acts 10:34. How does this Scripture make you feel?

Application: Have you ever wondered how your biblical background or upbringing affected how God saw you?

3. What are some "off menu" methods you've seen individuals or churches use to try to engage with the community around them?

Application: What are some creative methods you can use in your life to bring new believers to Christ?

4. In what ways do you think God is calling us to expand our borders as a church community?

Application: What was a time you felt called by God to step outside your comfort zone and share the Gospel with someone?

5. Peter needed to hear God's message three times before he understood it. Why do you think it was so difficult for him to accept what God was saying?

Application: Are there areas in your life where you feel God is repeatedly trying to get your attention?

Close in prayer.

WEEK FIVE

JOURNEY THROUGH TRIALS

Inevitably, we will face hardships and obstacles in life. It's imperative that we remain steadfast in faith and lean on prayer for strength during trials and opposition. Perseverance, conflict resolution, and divine redirection are all part of the transformative power of navigating trials with a focus on God's plan and mission. Difficult as it is in the moment, we should strive to view trials as opportunities for growth and wisdom, trusting in God's sovereign guidance through all of life's challenges.

Icebreaker

What's your favorite way to exercise? Least favorite?

Discussion Questions

1. How can we remain strong in our faith when facing trials and hardships?

Application: What is one personal challenge you're facing, and how can you apply perseverance and trust in God to your situation?

2. How can prayer help us in difficult times, such as when we face rejection or persecution?

Application: What is a specific situation in your life where you can practice intentional prayer to lean on God's strength?

3. How can we approach and resolve conflicts within the church in a godly manner?

Application: Have you experienced a conflict within the church? How could it have been resolved or approached more effectively using the principles mentioned above?

4. Paul and Barnabas had a hard falling out, but God used their disagreement for good. How can disagreements lead to divine redirection?

Application: Can you think of a time when a disagreement led to a positive change in your life or the lives of others? How did it impact your faith?

5. In Acts 13 and 14, Paul and Barnabas remained joyful and full of the Holy Spirit despite heavy persecution. How can suffering be viewed as a natural part of the gospel journey?

Application: How can you shift your perspective to see suffering as an opportunity for growth and sharing your faith?

Close in prayer.

WEEK SIX

FINISHING THE RACE

There are times in life when we can see a storm coming and know things are about to get rocky, but we can always find Jesus in the storm. Just as Jesus protected Paul during the voyage to Rome in Acts 27, we can be confident that He has already charted a safe course for us as well. As we boldly approach our storms with confidence, we show others what it looks like to tackle life as a follower of Jesus, encouraging them with our actions and the Gospel.

Icebreaker

What's your favorite animal at the zoo?

Discussion Questions

1. Read John 16:33. Jesus promises hardships in this world, but He doesn't say we'll know when they're coming. What's an unexpected hardship in your life?

Application: What can you do to prepare yourself to face unexpected storms?

2. In Acts 27:10-11, Paul warned the centurion of the incoming storm and that their journey was doomed, but the man wouldn't listen. How can we know when advice is legitimate and warnings should be followed?

Application: Who is someone in your life whose advice you always trust? What is it about that person that makes them trustworthy?

3. In Acts 27:22-25, Paul informs the men that the ship is doomed, but none of them will be harmed. He saw Jesus in the storm and shared the message. What are some ways to come back to and find Jesus in the storms of our lives?

Application: When have you been through a life storm in which you leaned into Jesus and found comfort?

4. How can you as a Christian boldly lead those you know are sinking in crisis?

Application: Who is one person in your life right now who needs the message of Jesus in the midst of a storm? How can you bring that message to them?

5. Read Acts 28:25-30. Paul stayed in Rome for two years and preached boldly and without hindrance despite resistance from his own people. How does one find this kind of confidence in Christ?

Application: Do you have the boldness to bring the Gospel to those around you? What would give you the confidence to do so?

Close in prayer.





FAQ



You said that this generosity initiative is going to use a One Fund approach. What do you mean by that?

The primary goal for this initiative is 100 percent engagement. We want every single person who is a part of King of Kings to take his or her next step in discipleship and grow in generosity. Using a One Fund approach, King of Kings will direct all generosity toward one fund, instead of multiple funds. This will include our two-year operating budget as well as money for future site expansion, special projects, and All In giving.

A few years ago, King of Kings sold the land we owned on Highway 370. Why aren't we using the money from the sale of the land instead of pursuing this generosity initiative?

The congregation of King of Kings, under the leadership of the Foundation Board and the Board of Lay Ministry, chose to retain and invest the principal from the sale of the land and use the accrued interest to support new campuses and new ministry at King of Kings. This interest will continue to generate money for King of Kings for years into the future.

I already gave to an initiative when King of Kings purchased the land. Why are you asking me to give again?

Even if we had retained the land, a second initiative would have been needed to develop the land and build on it. This is that second initiative. We are also funding new campuses in different locations, rather than building one facility on the land that had been purchased.

How does One Fund change my giving?

During this two-year period, every contribution to God's work through King of Kings is a contribution to the **Let's Go** initiative. Therefore, every Sunday becomes an opportunity to participate and contribute toward what God is doing in and through King of Kings to empower this vision.

What are you asking me to do?

Prepare your heart to hear God and then listen to what He says. Engage in personal reflection with God in this guidebook. Talk with your spouse, your family, or others about what this commitment will mean for this next season of your life. Whatever it is that God is calling you to do, we ask that you follow His lead. Finally, we ask that you prepare to be amazed. We serve an awesome God, and He is going to move in huge ways. We anticipate an unprecedented impact from our collective **Let's Go** commitments—something only God can do!

What if I have never given to King of Kings before?

Let's Go was crafted specifically with you in mind! **Let's Go** is a one fund generosity initiative. It's different from an old-fashioned fundraising drive, where you are called to give an extra gift above and beyond your normal giving—creating two steps for people who aren't yet giving. **Let's Go** is a call to sacrificial, Gospel-centered generosity for absolutely everyone at King of Kings. If you have never given before, this is your chance to be a part of something big with a committed sacrifice. We really hope you will.

What if I am new to King of Kings?

Let's Go is about the vision of our church and the spiritual practice of giving as followers of Jesus. We believe that the local church is the hope of the world. We would love for you to make King of Kings your home and join us in **Let's Go**. If you are ready for it, this is a perfect time for you to put a stake in the ground and make this your church.

Why does the church talk about money and giving so much?

Money is actually the topic that Jesus talked about most frequently in the Bible. Money is an important part of our discipleship to Jesus. For many, the desire for wealth stands in the way of the kind of selfless and sacrificial life Jesus calls us to, and money easily becomes an obstacle to seeking our eternal satisfaction in God. Jesus said that our hearts follow our treasure (Matthew 6:21). If we value wealth and comfort above all else, our hearts will be held captive to all sorts of material idols. However, when we give sacrificially to lay up treasures in heaven, our hearts will begin to beat for Christ's Kingdom, and we will follow Him joyfully wherever He might call us.

How long is my commitment?

We are asking that everyone make a two-year commitment. We all come together to present our commitment cards on Commitment Sunday, November 10. The fulfillment period for your commitment will begin on December 1, 2024, and it will culminate on December 1, 2026.

What forms of contribution will be accepted?

Contributions can be made online or via cash, check, and electronic fund transfer from your bank. Additional forms of contributions include

stocks, bonds, trusts, property, or other assets of that nature. You may have other resources that God has blessed you with in the past that He might be calling you to give during this time. Please let us know if you need assistance facilitating gifts of property or stock, and we would be happy to help you. Contact the church office if you have questions at 402.333.6464.

What if I can't afford to give right now or can't make a substantial financial commitment?

The widow who gave her last coin did not make a very big financial contribution, but Jesus said she gave the largest gift of all (Mark 12:41-44). All commitments made to the **Let's Go** initiative matter, regardless of the amount, because as we all participate according to our ability, God multiplies our giving, no matter the size of the gift, to do miraculous work. Biblical giving is about equal sacrifice for everyone, not equal amounts. Following God's direction is the most important part of this process.

What if I am severely in debt? Am I still supposed to give?

Giving isn't about what God wants from you; rather, it's about what God wants for you. It should be our joy and privilege to give at all times. If you are struggling with a large amount of debt or dealing with a recent job loss, you are responsible to care for yourself and your family through this difficult time. Spend time in prayer about the next step God is calling you to take and make a decision after that. Please contact the church office if you need assistance with this.
