#### Week25—Suicide

This week in Confirmation class, we discussed a deeply important and sensitive topic: suicide and the value of life. This conversation was approached with care, biblical truth, and compassion. Our goal was to give students hope, clarity, and resources to respond with love and courage.

#### **What We Covered**

- God is the author of life. (Psalm 139:13–16)
- Each person's life is sacred and valuable. (5th Commandment)
- God is near to the brokenhearted. (Psalm 34:18)
- Nothing can separate us from the love of Christ. (Romans 8:38–39)
- Suicide is a tragic distortion of God's good gift of life, but not beyond God's grace.

#### Why We Talked About It

Adolescence is a time when emotional, mental, and spiritual challenges arise. Talking openly about suicide in a biblical and compassionate way helps students:

- Know their life matters.
- Recognize when someone may need help.
- Understand that asking for help is a sign of strength.

### **Catechism Points**

- **5th Commandment**: We are called not only to avoid harming others, but to help and protect life—including our own.
- Gospel Promise: Jesus brings hope to the hurting. His grace is bigger than our sin or suffering.

#### What You Can Do

- Ask your student what stood out to them from the lesson.
- Remind them they can talk to you about anything.
- Reassure them of God's love and your support.

• Keep communication open about mental health.
