## Death and Resurrection of Jesus

### What We Covered

**Take Away Point:** Jesus died for our sins and rose to bring forgiveness and eternal life.

**Key Verse:** Luke 24:6 “He is not here; He has risen!”

### Why We Talked About It

Paul emphasizes the importance of Jesus' death and resurrection in 1 Corinthians 15:14: “And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.” This is THE most important thing. We know it is true so that others understand its significance.

### Catechism Connection

Second Article of The Apostles' Creed:

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

### What You Can Do

**Choose one reading and Discuss:**

- Luke 23:32–49 (The Crucifixion)
- Luke 24:1–12 (The Resurrection)
- Matthew 28:18-20
  - Why did Jesus have to die?
  - What does the resurrection mean for us today?
  - What difference does Jesus' resurrection make in your life now?
  - How can we be “witnesses” in our own world?

Challenge check-in: Students wrote the name of one person they'll share Jesus with this week through their actions, kindness, invitation, or conversation.

**Memory Word: Resurrection**

Definition: The act of rising from the dead.

Catechism tie-in: "I believe that on the third day He rose again from the dead..."
